We want to know what people need so they feel part of the community.



#### We want to

• make sure everyone feels supported



• improve mental health.



#### The group will

• tell us their ideas





help make a plan.





We get money from the government.



The money is to help the community.

Community organisations ask for the money.



We listen to the group to understand what needs to change in the community.



The group helps us decide where to spend the money.




Some of the money will help First Nations peoples.



If you are a First Nations person you can tell us where you think the money should go.

#### What happens in the group?



Each year the group has 10 meetings.



We will give you training about what you need to

know for the meetings



• do in the meetings.



You will need to get ready for the meetings.



You can help to

plan what the group will talk about





make sure the meetings start and end on time





• make sure everyone can have a say.

#### Who can join the group?



You can be a member if

• you live in Latrobe City



you can take part in our meetings





• you do **not** feel part of the community.

You can also be a member if

 you know someone who does not feel part of the community



 you know a lot about what people need to feel part of the community



you know a lot about mental health.

#### Why should you become a member?



The group is a good way to

connect with other people



share your ideas



share your skills



• get new skills



learn about the council and the community.



You get paid for coming to meetings.



We pay our members through bank deposits.



You can let us know if you need to be paid another way.

#### What rules do you need to follow?



We will tell you about rules you **must** follow.



You **must** treat everyone with **respect**.



Respect means we

• listen to each other **and** use good manners



• are kind and fair to everyone.



You **must** tell us if you have a **conflict** of interest.



Conflict of interest means you might **not** make fair choices.



You **must** keep the group information **private**.

Private means you do **not** tell anyone else about group information if we say you cannot.



You must ask us if you want to talk about the group or the council

on the news



- on social media
  - for example, Facebook.



#### What if you do not follow the rules?



If you do **not** follow the rules we might give you a warning.



A warning is when we remind you about the rules.



We might say you must stop being a member.



You can tell us if you do not agree with our decision.

# How will we know if the group is working?



You can tell us

what you like about the group



what you do not like about the group.





We will make sure the group is helping the community.





For example, we will listen to you and people like you.



We will check

what people think about the changes

• if people feel more part of the community.

### How can you apply?



You can apply to be a member in different ways.



For example, you can

write to us



meet us at our office



call us on the phone.



You can tell us

• how you like to communicate




• how we can support you.






We might ask you to do an interview.




We will tell you


• if you can be a member




the reasons for our decision.

A waiting list is to choose someone to join the group when someone else leaves.



You can be a member for 2 years.
