Thank you for your question during public question time on Monday, 15 September 2008:

Question - Transport Summit - Victorian Government


"It was reported in the media that no Councils in the Gippsland area provided a submission to the Transport Summit held in Melbourne last August.

Given the need to keep pressure in State & Commonwealth Governments to duplicate the Traralgon/Sale section of the Princes Highway, possible additional train services between the same two regions using a single carriage "Sprinter Train" and developing the Gippsland Inland Freight site as a transport interchange, if the Latrobe City did not provide a submission- why not?"

It is my understanding that Transport Summits were held across Victoria, during August and September, to assist the Victorian Government in developing the Victorian Transport Strategy.

The Gippsland Transport Summit was held on 5 August 2008 at Century Inn where the Minister for Roads and Ports explained to attendees that the aim of the Gippsland Summit was to seek Gippsland views on the development of the Victorian Transport Strategy. He also advised that the Gippsland session was the first consultation session to occur in the State. Latrobe City Council Mayor, Councillor and Officers attended the Summit and took the opportunity to provide a broad range of feedback direct to the Minister and Departmental staff. As the Victorian Transport Plan is in its development stage, submissions have not been called for. One would imagine that this would occur post the release of a draft paper.

HARD WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE

Thank you for your questions regarding the provision of a kerbside hard waste collection service received on 15 September 2008. Latrobe City Council is awaiting the release of the '*Guide to the Safe Collection of Hard Waste*' by the Victorian Work Cover Authority (WorkSafe). We have been informed by WorkSafe that the release of this document is likely to be within the next 4 to 6 weeks.

Unfortunately until this guide is released and full clarification of any future hard waste collection service is provided by WorkSafe, Latrobe City Council is unable to provide you with a substantive answer to your questions, relating to cost, extent of service or the level of liability Council is prepared to undertake.

You no doubt are aware that until the final document is reviewed, Latrobe City Council is offering an interim hard waste collection service. This service is a booked service offered in November 2008 and April 2009. The full cost of the service is \$60 per collection or a reduced fee of \$30 for pensioners and health care card holders.

10.1 PETITION REQUESTING THE DEVELOPMENT OF SKATE PARK**IN GLENGARRY****FILE NO: NA****AUTHOR: General Manager Built and Natural Environment Sustainability
(ATTACHMENT - YES)****1. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to present Council with a petition received requesting the development of a skate park in Glengarry and request that the petition be considered as part of the development of the Skate Park and BMX Track Plan that is currently under preparation.

2. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This report is consistent with Council's Latrobe 2021 vision document and the Council Plan 2008-2012.

Latrobe 2021 and Council Plan 2008-2012

Strategic Objective - Liveability

"To promote and support social, recreational, cultural and community life by providing both essential and innovative amenities, services and facilities within the municipality."

Strategic Action – Develop and maintain high quality recreation facilities in partnership with the community.

3. BACKGROUND

A petition was received on 12 August 2008, containing approximately 400 signatures and 18 letters of support, requesting the development of a skate park in Glengarry.

In January 2008 Latrobe City Council engaged consultants to undertake community consultation and site assessments to develop a skate park and BMX track plan to guide the future provision of these facilities within the municipality. Currently there are seven dirt BMX tracks and six skate facilities provided for the community by Latrobe City Council.

A draft plan was prepared by the consultants and presented to Council officers. Upon receipt, it was identified that further investigation and work was required on the plan prior to it being presented to Council for consideration. This further investigation and work is currently being completed to provide information on the distribution, standard and priorities for the provision of these facilities across the municipality.

4. ISSUES

Latrobe City Council receives regular requests for the development of skate and BMX facilities in various areas across the municipality. There is no adopted Council document or policy that provides guidance on the distribution or provision of these facilities. It may therefore be premature to allocate resources to any one particular skate park prior to Council consideration of a Skate Park and BMX Track Plan. It is anticipated that a draft plan will be ready for Council to consider in November 2008.

There appears to be little value in laying this petition on the table. A more considered response to the petitioners would be possible once the draft plan has been adopted by Council. Along with professional opinion and other consultation, the views of the petition can be considered as input to the draft plan.

5. FINANCIAL AND RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS

An allocation of \$100,000 has been made in the 2008/09 capital works program towards implementing the highest priority actions from the skate and BMX track plan.

6. INTERNAL/EXTERNAL CONSULTATION

Engagement Method Used:

Site inspections, community meetings and surveys

Details of Community/Consultation Results of Engagement:

The consultation completed towards the development of the skate BMX track plan indicated support for the development of additional facilities and the upgrading of existing sites.

7. OPTIONS

Options available to Council include:

1. Support the proposed development of a skate park in Glengarry prior to the adoption of the skate park BMX track plan.
2. Inform the head petitioner that the allocation of funds towards the development of a skate facility in Glengarry will be addressed through the adoption of a skate park and BMX track plan.
3. Lay the petition on the table and present a further report to the ordinary council meeting on 6 October 2008.

8. CONCLUSION

The development of new a skate facility needs to be considered in terms of the provision of facilities across the municipality. Guidance on the provision of skate and BMX facilities will be provided through the skate park BMX track plan that is currently being prepared for Council consideration.

9. RECOMMENDATION

1. **That Council agrees to not lay the petition on the table, relating to the development of a skate facility in Glengarry, and agrees to deal with the petition at this Ordinary Council Meeting.**
2. **That the petition requesting the development of a skate facility in Glengarry be considered through the development and adoption of the skate park and BMX track plan.**
3. **That the head petitioner be advised of Council's decision in relation to the petition requesting the development of a skate facility in Glengarry.**

The Ripper Sk8 Krew asks for Latrobe City Council to join in partnership with them to build this park. We are aware that contained within Latrobe City Councils 2008/2009 Budget there has been \$100,000 allocated to Skate & BMX Plans as part of the Capital Works Program.

The Ripper Sk8 Krew seek information from Latrobe City on whether part of this allocated funding could indeed be utilised to assist with the construction of the Glengarry Skate Park given the level of business and community support, financial pledges and commitment to this project. The petition alone is indicative of the enormous need for such a facility within our township.

We trust Latrobe City will acknowledge the perseverance of our group and provide their support. The Ripper Sk8 Krew and the Glengarry community have the commitment and drive to progress this important community asset, and I implore Latrobe City to also commit to this vital project for the benefit of our local youth and community in general.

The Ripper SK8 Krew.

The "Ripper SK8 krew is a group of 13 young men from Glengarry who are skateboard, scooter and BMX bike riders and who had identified a lack of recreational facilities for young people in their town. In April last year the young people and I attended a skateboard art workshop as part of "Youth Week" and it was there they decided to form the Krew and work towards getting a skatepark for their town.

The first step was to attend Latrobe City's "Small Towns Forum" and put forward their case. The forum gave the skatepark as its priority for Glengarry. From that point a committee was formed comprising of the young people, myself as their coordinator, and an invitation was made (and accepted) to Russell Northe MP for Morwell to join. There is also a member of the Victorian Police on board. Parents also take part. Office bearers were elected and the above logo was designed by the president Josh Anderson.

Throughout 2007 the Krew has held meetings which have included representatives from Latrobe City and members of the Glengarry Residents committee, they also attend meetings of the Glengarry Residents Committee. We have liaised with and visited with the committees of Neerium South and Boolarra skateparks who also went through this process to achieve their goals. The Krew has visited several skateparks to gauge what they would looking in order to best suit all the skateboarders, bikeriders, scooter riders and roller bladers who will use the park. The Krew has attended fundraising workshops and have written letters to all Glengarry business's to garner support. They also are circulating a petition in the community to support their cause. Local newspaper "The Journal" has supported the Krew with several articles appearing in the paper to acknowledge their efforts. The Krew has also taken part in Latrobe city's Skatepark consultations, meeting with the consultants, Councillor Susan Lloyd, others from Latrobe city and also other Glengarry community members. Russell couldn't be there that day and the federal member of parliament Peter Hall filled in to back the Krew.

The Glengarry community has rallied behind the Krew and given much support and encouragement as has Latrobe City which has resulted in the young members of the committee being nominated and presented with A special "Latrobe City Australia Day award for young citizens". At Australia celebrations in Kernot Hall, the Krew were presented with individual awards and also with an Australia day medal. They hope that if the skatepark is eventually built the medal will be on permanent display there.

2008 will be the start of fundraising and the formation of a committee has begun. The Krew will be attending some events for young people this year and will be working to raise funds by selling food and drinks. This year will also see the writing of submissions for grants to boost funding.


I am writing to give my support to the "Ripper Sk8 Krew" in their efforts to gain a skatepark for Glengarry.

Both of these situations present dangers to the kids and elderly people with the amount of vehicle traffic that also uses the main street.





THESE skaters, BMX and scooter riders are hoping they won't be forced to ride along the Glengarry streets any more, if their town gets a skate park.

The Ripper Sk8 Park Krew/Committee was recognised on Australia Day for its commitment to campaigning for a skate park for the town.

The group formed last year, with the aim of gaining funding to build a skate park that it believes is desperately needed for the town's young people.

The group comprises Josh Anderson (president), Declan Morrison, Jack Anderson, Nick Sacco, Billy Duncan, Andy Duncan, Luke Duncan, James Bowman,

Geordie Johnson, Sam Pendergast, Jake Pendergast and Robbie Elrick.

They were all recognised in the youth category by Latrobe City Council on Australia Day.

Group president Josh Anderson said the award made the group feel "important" and he hoped it would highlight the need for a skate park in the town.

He said the ideal location for the facility would be next to the current BMX track in Main Street, because it was central and visible for parents.

The young skaters and riders currently have to get their parents to drive them to Traralgon or other towns to use a skate park.

Youth development officer for Luke's Place, Kilmory Uniting Care, Helma Morrison, has coordinated the group and said she hoped its

persistence would pay off.

"I'm very proud of their efforts and (the award) is great because young people don't often get a lot of recognition."

She said the group had recently met with a Latrobe City consultant as part of the council's review of skating and BMX facilities in the Latrobe Valley.

The group is currently circulating a petition in support of the skate park and is looking at ways to raise funds, including the availability of government grants.

Latrobe City councillor Susan Lloyd congratulated the boys on their commitment.

"I think it's fantastic young people have stepped up for what they believe in and they are advocating on the part of other young people," she said.

Nationals MLA for Morwell Russell Northe said he was pleased to see such a young group receive some accolades on Australia Day.

"I know they were very proud.

"The next step is to ensure Glengarry can achieve a skate park and there's certainly no doubt that they're dedicated to the cause."

Mr Northe said he expected the town's population to grow in the future and a skate park was important to cater to the needs of young people.

He said the group was "unselfish" because it was focused on getting a skate park for the town and younger generations, not just for themselves.

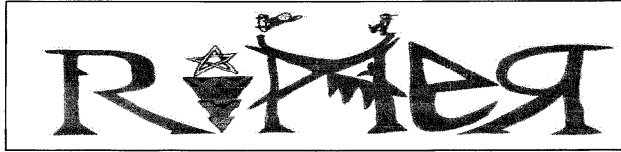

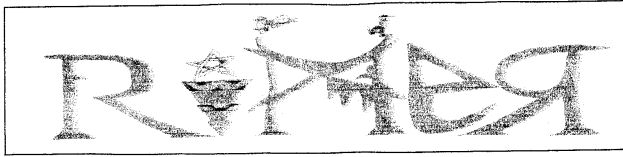

11.3.1 HARD WASTE SERVICE UPDATE REPORT

AUTHOR: General Manager Built and Natural Environment Sustainability
(ATTACHMENT – NO)

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to provide Council with updated information regarding the trialed Hard Waste Collection Service introduced in September 2007.

2. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This report is consistent with Council's Latrobe 2021 vision document and the Council Plan 2008-2012.

Latrobe 2021 and Council Plan 2008-2012

Strategic Objective - Sustainability

To promote the responsible and sustainable care of our diverse built and natural environment for the use and enjoyment of the people who make up the community of Latrobe Valley. To provide leadership and to facilitate a well connected, interactive economic environment in which to do business.

Strategic Action - Natural Sustainability

Develop facilities to manage waste which enhance the desirability for economic development within Latrobe City.

Key Priority

Collect and process waste in accordance with the waste management strategy.

Policy/Strategy: Latrobe City Waste Management Principles:

1. *Latrobe City will advocate the following waste hierarchy.*
 - *Avoidance;*
 - *Re-use;*
 - *Recycling;*
 - *Recovery of energy;*
 - *Treatment;*
 - *Containment;*
 - *Disposal.*

2. *Latrobe City will strive to be a leader in the management of solid waste. The disposal behaviour exhibited by the Latrobe City organisation shall be equal to or greater than what we expect from the community.*
3. *Latrobe City will apply the principles of Ecologically Sustainable Development (ESD) when developing infrastructure, services and action relating to waste management. ESD principles are:*
 - *Inter-generational Equity;*
 - *Intra-generational Equity;*
 - *Conservation of Biodiversity;*
 - *Precautionary Principle; and*
 - *Global issues.*
4. *Latrobe City acknowledges that the waste generator will be responsible for choosing the appropriate disposal option and the costs associated with that disposal choice.*
5. *Latrobe City will ensure that the actual costs of waste treatment are applied to that service.*
6. *Latrobe City will advocate the need for greater manufacturer's responsibility in material management.*
7. *Latrobe City will be an active regional partner and will consider the regional benefit to social, economic and environmental aspects in the development of waste management services and infrastructure.*
8. *Latrobe City will ensure that it moves to a greater emphasis on material management by ensuring that available data on the quality of waste is obtained to determine its appropriate treatment.*
9. *Latrobe City will develop treatment objectives for handling municipal solid waste. Where appropriate Latrobe City will provide services and infrastructure to support these treatment objectives.*
10. *Latrobe City will continue to identify opportunities for reducing the volume of waste deposited to landfill.*

3. BACKGROUND

The Hard Waste Project Review Group was established in 2006 to re-evaluate the decision to suspend the provision of a kerbside hard waste collection service. The project review group consisted of Councillors, community representatives, Council officers and WorkSafe representatives.

The group held a series of meetings to investigate options for the reinstatement of an appropriate hard waste service. The review group agreed on a preferred model for the provision of a service that included the provision of transfer station vouchers and an optional at-call service. Council subsequently endorsed the recommendations of the project review group and resolved as follows at the 19 March 2007 Ordinary Council Meeting:

1. *That the following hard waste service be provided, commencing in the 2007/08 financial year:*
 - *Provision of three vouchers, valued at \$8 each, to all ratepayers in the waste collection areas.*
 - *Vouchers to be distributed to ratepayers with the rates notices.*
 - *Increase the Waste Service Charge by \$24 above the CPI increase of \$5, to cover the cost of the vouchers.*
 - *Amend the transfer station fees to equate to multiples of \$8 for ease of use of the vouchers.*
 - *Allow residents to dispose of all material accepted by the transfer stations, with the utilisation of vouchers.*
 - *Allow residents to book an at-call hard waste collection service limited to the items on the approved list, and a maximum quantity of 1.5 cubic metres.*
 - *The at-call service to cost residents \$43 in addition to the three vouchers.*
 - *Subsidise pensioners and health card holders for the at-call service by \$13 on the assumption that only 90% of vouchers will be utilised.*
 - *This would result in an at-call service for pensioners and health card holders being \$30 in addition to the three vouchers.*
 - *Provide for two separate months in the year for residents to book an at-call service – possibly October and April.*
 - *Continue to provide the two free green waste disposal weekends, with one of them being in the lead up to the fire season.*
2. *That the hard waste project review group meet on a 3 to 4 monthly basis, following commencement of the hard waste service, to monitor and review the hard waste service.*

The trial hard waste collection service was operated in accordance with the Council resolution from 1 September 2007. Numerous complaints were received between the time the vouchers were issued and the meeting of the Hard Waste Review Group on 30 October 2007. A further report was presented to Council on 19 November 2007 to consider the groups recommendations.

It was noted that the Hard Waste Review Group was divided in its opinion on the provision of a hard waste collection service and that the service should be modified to provide a more equitable option for the community.

Council resolved at the Ordinary Council Meeting held on 19 November 2007 to amend the service as follows:

- a) *Return any unused vouchers by 1 May, 2008 and receive a credit for the commensurate amount.*
- b) *Utilise the vouchers as part payment for the at-call kerbside hard waste collection service as booked to date or the at-call kerbside hard waste collection service planned for April, 2008.*
- c) *Utilise vouchers at Council operated Transfer Stations throughout the 2007/08 financial year.*

Officers intended to report on the results of voucher at the earliest possible Council Meeting following the expiry of the issued vouchers.

4. ISSUES

Latrobe City Council intends to provide all data relating to the use, refund or non-redemption of the issued vouchers.

There has been extensive use of the vouchers at the Transfer stations prior to their expiry on 31 August 2008. Latrobe City Council is in the process of recording and analysing the data to provide meaningful advice of the results.

Results of this analysis will be available for Council's consideration on 6 October 2008.

5. FINANCIAL AND RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS

The financial and resource implications of the trial Hard Waste Service will be detailed in the Hard Waste Analysis Report, to be provided to Council at the Ordinary Council Meeting to be held on 6 October 2008.

6. INTERNAL/EXTERNAL CONSULTATION

Engagement Method Used:

Latrobe City Council has utilised the following methods of engagement; Print Media, Link, personal letters, independent consultants and focus groups.

Details of Community/Consultation Results of Engagement:

Latrobe City officers have received many representations regarding the former service. Officers have been active in requesting guidance and providing input to the provision of future kerbside hard waste services within the state of Victoria.

7. OPTIONS

Options relating to the trialled Hard Waste Service will be tabled in the forthcoming Hard Waste Analysis Report.

8. CONCLUSION

The analysis of the trial Hard Waste Collection Service offered in the 2007/08 financial year will inform Council as to the use of the vouchers.

The results are likely to give an insight into areas Council can best provide future services related to the collection and disposal of bulky waste material generated by the community.

9. RECOMMENDATION

That Council considers the Hard Waste Analysis Report at the Ordinary Council Meeting to be held on 6 October 2008.

1. PURPOSE

2. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Strategic Objective - Governance

To ensure governance and leadership through a strong commitment and adherence to democratic and legislative requirements.

Strategic Action- Ensure compliance with the Local Government Act.

Policy No. GEN-COS – Audit Policy

The audit policy defines the role of the audit committee which includes assisting Council in the discharge of its responsibilities for financial reporting.

3. BACKGROUND

The *Local Government Act 1989* requires Council to prepare an annual report that includes a report on its operations for the completed financial year. The annual report includes audited financial, standard and performance statements. The auditor must not sign the auditor's report concerning the financial, standard and performance statements unless Council has completed the certification of the statements in the manner prescribed in the *Local Government Act 1989* and the *Local Government (Financial and Reporting) Regulations 2004*.

4. ISSUES

The annual report, including the audited financial, standard and performance statements, must be lodged with the Minister within three months of the end of the financial year, which is by 30 September 2008.

Under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1989*, a Council cannot submit its financial, standard and performance statements to the Auditor-General or the Minister unless a resolution has been passed by Council authorising two Councillors to certify the financial statements in their final form.

Once the auditor's report has been received by Council, public notice will be given in accordance with Section 131 (12) of the *Local Government Act 1989* and the auditor's reports will be made available for inspection at all Council offices.

Similarly, once the Annual Report has been submitted to the Minister for Local Government, public notice will also be given advising that the Annual Report can be inspected at all Council offices. In accordance with Section 134 of the *Local Government Act 1989* a meeting of Council will be held as soon as practicable, to consider the annual report, within the time required by the regulations, being one month after providing the annual report to the Minister

5. FINANCIAL AND RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS

The subject reports are in respect of the Council's financial position and operations for the year ended 30 June 2008. There are no financial or resource implications.

6. INTERNAL/EXTERNAL CONSULTATION

Engagement Method Used:

Councillors Middlemiss and White are the Council appointed members of the Audit Committee and attended the meeting held on 4 September 2008 where the Audit Committee reviewed and discussed the draft financial, standard and performance statements and provided their endorsement for Council approval in principle.

Staff from the Victorian Auditor General's Office, who conducted the Latrobe City audit, attended the audit committee meeting on 4 September 2008. They tabled a closing audit report to the audit committee which concluded that the financial reports of Latrobe City Council do present fairly in all material aspects.

7. OPTIONS

This process is a legislative requirement which Council is required to comply with.

8. CONCLUSION

As Councillors Middlemiss and White are the appointed members of Council's Audit Committee and involved in the review of the financial, standard and performance statements, it is appropriate that they be the nominated to certify the financial, standard and performance statements, on behalf of Council.

The recommendations below are necessary to comply with statutory requirements of the *Local Government Act 1989* and the *Local Government (Financial and Reporting) Regulations 2004*.

11.6.3 PLACE NAME PROPOSAL - BALFOUR RESERVE, MOE

AUTHOR: Acting General Manager Governance
(ATTACHMENT – YES)

1. PURPOSE

The following report presents for Council's consideration a proposal for the naming of the municipal purpose reserve, located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street, Moe.

2. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This report is consistent with Council's Latrobe 2021 vision document and the Council Plan 2008-2012.

Latrobe 2021 and Council Plan 2008-2012

Strategic Objective - Governance

To ensure governance and leadership through a strong commitment and adhere to democratic processes and legislative requirements.

Strategic Action - Ensure compliance with other relevant legislation.

Policy No. - There is no specific policy relating to Road Name or Place Name Changes. The procedure is specified by the Geographic Place Names Act and Guidelines.

3. BACKGROUND

Council has received a suggestion by a community member (attached) that the unnamed municipal purpose reserve located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street, Moe be named Jim Balfour Park.

This reserve was created on Plan of Subdivision PS 441953 when the former Moe High School site was subdivided into residential allotments in 2003.

The former Moe High School hall/gymnasium fronting Truscott Road was named Balfour Hall in recognition of James Charles Murray Balfour, former School Councillor and former Member of the Legislative Assembly for Morwell and Narracan and Liberal Government Minister. A short history of Mr Balfour's career is attached to this report.

A Building Approvals Permit to demolish Balfour Hall was issued on November 2001, with demolition occurring thereafter.

4. ISSUES

The Guidelines for Geographic Place Names specify that Councils, as naming authorities, have two major areas of responsibility:

1. the investigation and determination of geographic place names of local significance.
2. the notification of new or altered names to the Registrar for official mapping data and other purposes.

In doing so Council must give consideration to the 17 principles contained in the guidelines when determining Victorian place or feature names. The following principles apply to this application:

Principle 1 – Responsibility for naming

As this is a place of local significance Council is the responsible naming authority.

Principle 3 – Linking the name to the place

Based upon the above history it can be seen that Mr Balfour has a historical link to the former Moe High School site.

Principle 7 – Duplication of names

With the exception of the demolished Balfour Hall, there is no other place within Latrobe City that contains the name “Balfour” on the Register of Geographic Place Names (Vicnames).

The following entries appear in the adopted Latrobe City Register of Public Roads:

- Balfour Place, Churchill; and
- Balfour Street, Newborough.

It is noted that Vicnames has recorded places containing the name Balfour in two adjoining municipalities. These are:

- Balfour Swamp – Wellington Shire; and
- James Balfour Oak Tree Park – Baw Baw Shire.

Consideration has been given to the merits of the terms 'park' and/or 'reserve'. It is suggested that the use of 'reserve' will reduce potential confusion with Balfour Place. It is anticipated that the naming of Balfour Reserve will not cause any confusion with either the street names or the adjoining municipalities.

Principle 10 – Consultative process

Should Council proceed and invite public comment on the proposal to name the municipal purposes reserve it will satisfy this principle.

Principle 13 – Commemorative names

Naming authorities should not name places after living persons, unless exceptional circumstances apply. As Mr Balfour died in 1990 the proposal will not conflict with this principle.

Principle 17 – Preserving a record of place names' origins

Details will be collected from various sources to support the proposal.

Following consultation and resolution to name the reserve, it will be necessary for Council to prepare an application to the Registrar of Geographic Names to have the unnamed municipal purposes reserve recorded in the Vicnames register.

It is suggested that if a plaque or signage is erected that reference is made to the fact that this reserve was the site of the former Moe High School.

5. FINANCIAL AND RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS

The costs associated with this proposal are minimal, being the cost of advertising the proposal.

In the event the reserve is named, expenditure for either a sign or plaque would be incurred.

6. INTERNAL/EXTERNAL CONSULTATION

Engagement Method:

Should the proposal be accepted Public Notices will be placed in the Latrobe Valley Express. The Moe Historical Society will be specifically invited to discuss the proposal.

Details of Community/Consultation Results of Engagement:

Similar to the provisions of Section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989 it is proposed to give public notice of Council's intention to consider naming the reserve Balfour Reserve. Any objections would be considered at a subsequent Council meeting.

The suggested reserve name has been discussed with a representative of the Balfour family. This representative consulted other members of the family and has advised that the family supports the proposed naming of the reserve.

7. OPTIONS

Council has the following options:

1. To resolve to commence the statutory process to name the municipal purpose reserve, located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street Moe; or
2. To resolve not to proceed with the statutory process to name the municipal purpose reserve, located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street Moe which will require no further action.

8. CONCLUSION

Based upon the above information it is recommended that Council supports in principle the naming of the municipal purpose reserve, located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street, Jim Balfour Reserve.

To allow the general public to have input into the naming of the reserve it is suggested that Council now gives public notice of its intention to consider the proposal and invite comment.

9. RECOMMENDATION

1. **That Council gives support, in principle, to the naming of the municipal purpose reserve, located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street, Moe, Jim Balfour Reserve.**

2. That Council gives public notice of its intention to consider the proposal to the naming of the municipal purpose reserve located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street, Moe, Jim Balfour Reserve and seeks public comment.
3. That Council considers any submissions received in relation to the proposal to name the municipal purpose reserve, located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street, Moe, Jim Balfour Reserve at the Ordinary Council Meeting to be held on 15 December 2008.
4. That, if no objections are received, an application to be made to the Registrar of Geographic Names to register the municipal purpose reserve, located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street, Moe with Jim Balfour Reserve as a place name.
5. That, if the application to the Registrar of Geographic Names to register the municipal purpose reserve, located at Parkside Drive and Lloyd Street, Moe with Jim Balfour Reserve as a place name is successful that an appropriate plaque or sign be erected including reference to this reserve having formerly been the site of the Moe High School.

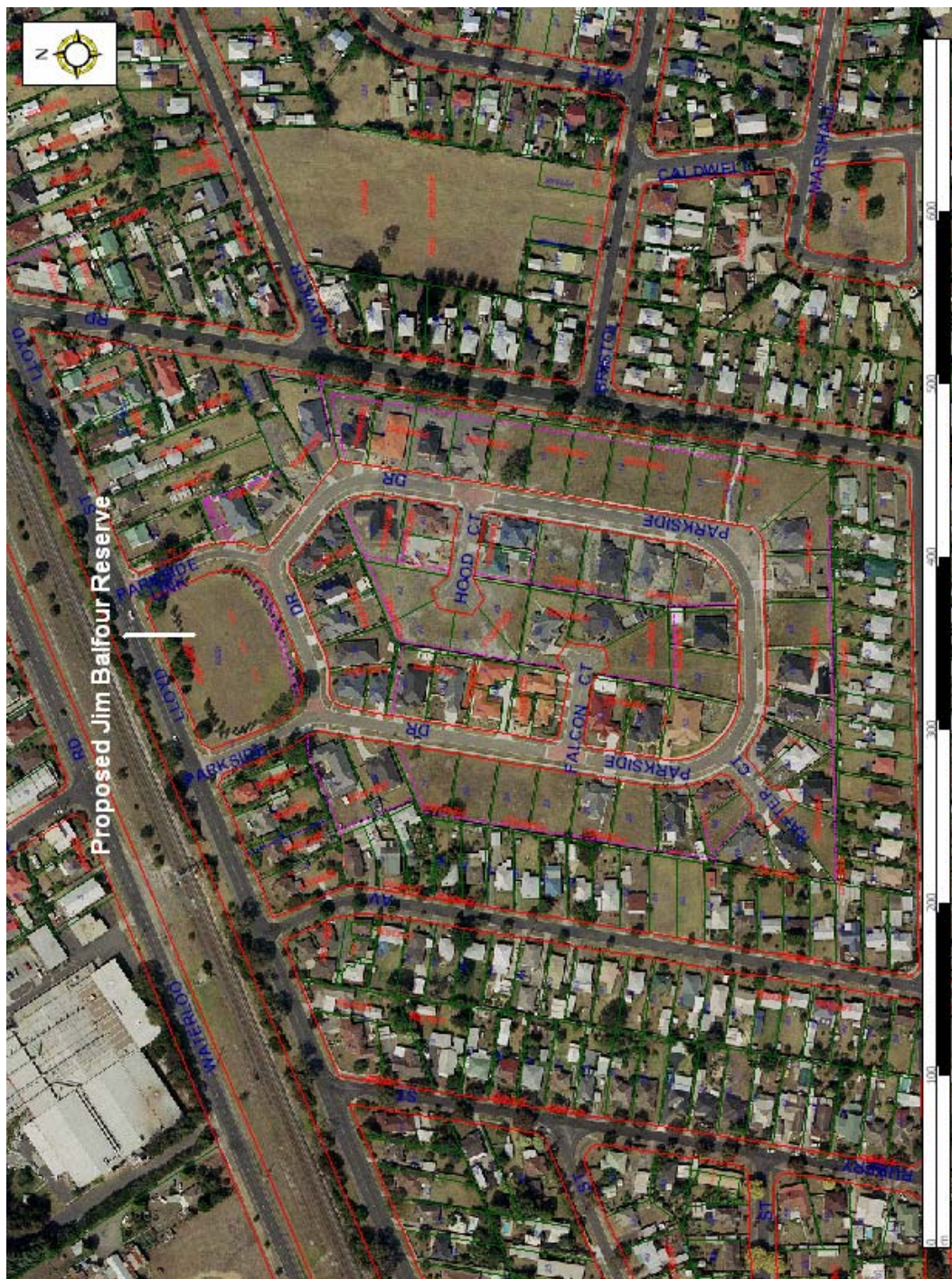
