Question 1:

Topic: Capital Improved Value (CIV) Rating

Question:

Does Council have an estimate of the number of residential properties in South Ward that would have a rise in rates if Capital Improvement Value rating was discontinued in favour of another method of assessment?

Response:

Local government rates in Victoria are based on the most recent property valuations undertaken by the Victorian Valuer-General.

Council has the ability to distribute rates by utilising one of the following valuation methods being Capital Improved Value, Site Value or Net Annual Value (represents the annual rental value of a property).

The 2020 Local Government Rating Review recommended the state government consider the benefits of a valuation averaging mechanism (VAM) to mitigate the impact of significant changes in property valuations on rates. Local Government Victoria advised in April 2024, that the Victorian Government has decided not to proceed with further consideration of a VAM.

Council utilises the Capital Improved Value (CIV) as the most appropriate valuation base/method for distributing rates as detailed in Council's adopted Revenue and Rating Plan 2021-2025. Modelling of alternative valuation processes and the impact on individual annual rates notices has not been undertaken. Any change to the valuation method used would impact all ratepayers in Latrobe City and if a change were to be considered in the future, Council would undertake community consultation as part of any revised Revenue and Rating Plan.

Question 2:

Topic: Membership of Municipal Association of Victoria (MAV)

Question:

If the Municipal Association of Victoria was disbanded or Latrobe City withdrew from the body would there be increased costs to council putting upward pressure rates during a cost of living crisis and a decrease in the ability to service council and community needs?

Response:

Latrobe City Council is a member of the Municipal Association of Victoria (MAV), with annual membership fees paid for the 2024/25 financial year.

Membership of MAV provides many benefits to Council. One of the financial benefits provided to Council is the ability to leverage off MAV's aggregated purchasing power, which allows Latrobe City Council to access better pricing and terms as MAV can combine the purchasing needs of multiple councils.

On balance, withdrawing from MAV membership would result in, among other things, higher costs being incurred for a variety of goods and services if they had to be procured directly at a smaller scale.

Topic: Transparency and Accountability Policies in Local Government

Question:

What is Council's policy for ensuring full cooperation and transparency in the event of an Ombudsman or Local Government Inspectorate or Independent Broad-based Anti-corruption Commission investigation into conduct of Latrobe City's Executive Team or Councillors?

Response:

Council is obliged to comply with requirements of any investigations undertaken by oversight agencies, including the Local Government Inspectorate, the Victorian Ombudsman and IBAC. This requirement is set out in the Local Government Act and legislation of each of the relevant agencies.

Therefore no policy is required to be developed by Council as each of these agencies have been provided with the necessary powers to ensure that this happens and, in some cases, take action against those who fail to comply with an investigation or provide false or misleading information.

Additionally, Council has an established Integrity Framework that ensures that we demonstrate high levels of compliance with legislative requirements at all times and this includes cooperating with any investigation by the agencies identified.

The relevant agencies determine if any matters that they investigate are made publicly available.

Question:

Has the Latrobe City Council published a consolidated list of all deviations in its Governance Rules from that of the Local Government Model Rules as set out in the Local Government Act 2020?

Response:

The Local Government Act does not detail a model set of Governance Rules.

IBAC's special report on Operation Sandon made a recommendation that the Local Government Minister ensures that *Local Government Victoria develops* and publishes Model Governance Rules to operate as the minimum standards for council meeting procedures. While the Minister has made a public statement accepting this recommendation 'in-principle', there has been no further information provided to Councils at this stage.

VCAT APPEAL - AMENDED APPLICATION FOR SERVICE STATION AT 182 PRINCES STREET, TRARALGON

- 2. The proposal is inconsistent with the objectives and policy of Clause 13.07 1S (Land Use Compatibility) as the use and development of land for a service station of the proposed scale is not compatible with adjoining and nearby residential land uses; and
- 3. The proposal is inconsistent with the strategies with Clause 11.01-1L (Traralgon Structure Plan) as it proposes a use with significant economic impact that will be located outside the Traralgon Primary Activity Centre (TTSP Area 3), Argyle Street (TTSP Area 4) and Princes Highway and Stammers Road (TTSP Area 5); and
- 4. The proposal is not consistent with Clause 65.01 (approval of an application or plan) as the proposed use and development has the potential to affect human health, the amenity of the area and the orderly planning of the area.
