### **Question 1:**

From: Mr Christopher Kaczkowski

**Topic:** Waiver by Application – Financial Hardship

**Question:** Has Latrobe City Council considered, or is considering, waiving or reducing Council rates for people and businesses that may be suffering, or who may suffer financial hardship, due to power station closures and ending of native timber harvesting?

**Response:** Latrobe City Council gave careful consideration to the impacts of financial hardship when adopting the current version of the *Financial Hardship Policy* in 2020. The policy is scheduled to be reviewed in 2024. The policy recognises that financial hardship may arise for many reasons, each case is therefore considered consistently, sensitively, and confidentially on its own merits within the bounds of the policy. Relief under this policy is limited to waiver of interest and legal fees on overdue payments, a deferment or agreeing upon a payment arrangement.

### Question 2:

From: Kelvin Granger and Dean Hurlston, Council Watch Inc.

**Topic:** Cost Shifting

**Question:** Can Council please advise the dollar (\$) amount of "cost shifting from State Government" they estimate they incurred in 2022/23 Financial Year?

**Response:** In broad terms, although there is no agreed definition of cost shifting, it is generally accepted that cost shifting occurs when State and Federal Governments transfer program or service responsibilities to local government with insufficient funding or provide grants that don't keep pace with the actual delivery costs incurred by councils.

Council has not quantified the extent or financial impact of cost shifting.

Cost shifting challenges however are often associated with the following areas of Council:

- Library services
- School crossing supervision
- Emergency management (preparedness, response and recovery)
- Maintenance and upkeep of State-owned infrastructure and assets

We also acknowledge though the support the State and Federal Government does provide council through significant recurring and capital grants each financial year. Without these funding streams council's capacity to deliver many programs and projects for the community would not be achievable.

APPLICATION 2022/233 - DEVELOPMENT OF 52 DWELLINGS, 52 LOT SUBDIVISION, REDUCTION OF 3 VISITOR CAR PARKING SPACES AND CREATION AND REMOVAL OF AN EASEMENT AT 23 DUNBAR ROAD, TRARALGON

That Council issues a Notice of Refusal to Grant a Permit for the development of land with 52 dwellings on a lot, 52 lot subdivision of land, reduction of 3 visitor car parking spaces and the creation and removal of an easement at 23 Dunbar Road, Traralgon (Crown Allotment 79L Parish of Traralgon), on the following grounds:

- a) The proposal is inconsistent with the Municipal Planning Strategy and the Planning Policy Framework, specifically Clauses 02.03-7 (Industry) 11.01-1L (Traralgon), 13.07-1S (Land use compatibility), 16.01-1S (Housing supply) and 16.01-1L (Housing supply), which seek to ensure that residential intensification does not prejudice the operation of the Graymont Lime Batching Plant and Janette Street Industrial Precinct.
- b) The proposal is inconsistent with the purpose and decision guidelines of the Mixed Use Zone, in that the proposal represents an unreasonable intensification of development that creates unacceptable risk of land use conflict to existing industry.
- c) The application is considered to be premature in the absence of strategic work that provides support to intensification of residential development adjacent to the Janette Street Industrial Precinct and Graymont Lime Batching Plant.
- d) The proposal fails to meet the following objectives of Clause 55 and 56 (ResCode):
  - i. Clause 55.02-2 Residential policy
  - ii. Clause 55.03-9 Access
  - iii. Clause 55.04-8 Noise impacts
  - iv. Clause 56.03-4 Built environment
