These changes encourage the Minister administering the <i>Mineral Resources</i> (<i>Sustainable Development</i>) <i>Act</i> 1990 to provide timely advice regarding the future form of the Environmental Significance Overlay (ESO1) so as to provide clear direction for future urban development adjacent to the Urban Coal Buffer. The changes also encourage relevant geotechnical land form testing and monitoring information to be provided to Planning Authorities, relevant government departments and the community prior to any proposed changes to the existing ESO1. Furthermore, the changes encourage the Minister administering the <i>Mineral Resources</i> (<i>Sustainable Development</i>) <i>Act</i> 1990 to ensure that environmental and geotechnical risks are managed and reduced as far as is possible by mining licensees and encourages the need for the Minister to undertake a risk assessment that clarifies whether any revision of the ESO1 Urban Coal Buffer is required by the end of 2018. The changes have been informed by geotechnical work and investigations post the C87 panel. In particular, the changes include an interim strategy due to geotechnical concerns, to discourage future subdivision or an increase in existing dwelling density or rezoning of land in Area 21 until the outcome of a risk assessment is known that may inform the need for engineering guidance for the construction of new structures in the Area. These changes to exhibited C87 allow for further risk assessment and geotechnical monitoring work to be undertaken that may take some time to finalise. This work is not required to be finalised prior to council determining the planning scheme amendment as C87 does no	No

The planning panel's recommendation will affect an additional 901 dwellings compared to the exhibited agreed adjusted UAB. The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) and Australian Paper (AP) were consulted regarding extending the UAB from the agreed adjusted UAB to AP/GHDs modelled 10 odour unit contour. EPA in their advisory capacity and AP both support the exhibited C87 adjusted UAB if council was to adopt this position.	No
